

“Remember” (*Remember the Lost,
Remember the Cost*)

Scripture text: 2 Peter 3:1-13

Remember the Lost, Remember the Cost

As we celebrate this Memorial Day, I am asking you to **“Remember”**.

Remember those who have died, gone before us, sacrificed their lives that we might live. Let us not let them and their efforts be in vain!

For it has cost them so much and has affected so many.

Who here has lost a loved one in our Nations conflicts?

“We are bound to the future Almighty God warned us about long ago, NOT because He wants that for us, but because we chose it as a result of our sin and rebellion.”

We must “remember the cost” and seek to save that which is lost.

It is **in love** that I share this message with you today, not to scare you but to help you prepare.

May we “remember the lost & remember the Cost!

It is possible to have a pure and sincere mind and yet have a bad memory!

Peter wrote this second letter primarily **to awaken and arouse his readers** (2 Peter 1:12–15).

It is easy for Christians to “**get accustomed to God’s truth.**” Eutychus went to sleep listening to Paul preach! (Acts 20:7–10) **Our Heavenly Father sacrificed so that we might have the truth of the Word and the freedom to practice it, but too often we take this for granted and become complacent. The church needs to be aroused regularly lest the enemy find us asleep and take advantage of our spiritual lethargy.**

2 Peter 2:12-15 But these, like irrational animals, creatures of instinct, born to be caught and destroyed, blaspheming about matters of which they are ignorant, will also be destroyed in their destruction, suffering wrong as the wage for their wrongdoing. **They count it pleasure to revel in the daytime.** They are blots and blemishes, **reveling in their deceptions,** while they feast with you. **They have eyes full of adultery, insatiable for sin.** They entice unsteady souls. They have **hearts trained in greed.** **Accursed children!** Forsaking the right way, **they have gone astray.** They have followed the way of Balaam, the son of Beor, **who loved gain from wrongdoing,**

Act 20:7-10 On the **first day of the week**, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul talked with them, intending to depart on the next day, and he prolonged his speech until midnight. There were many lamps in the upper room where we were gathered. And a young man named **Eutychus**, sitting at the window, **sank into a deep sleep as Paul talked still longer**. And **being overcome by sleep**, he fell down from the third story and was taken up dead. But Paul went down and bent over him, and taking him in his arms, said, "**Do not be alarmed, for his life is in him.**"

Because God's Word is true, we must pay attention to it and take its message seriously.

New converts must be taught the Word and established in the doctrines of the faith, for new Christians are the apostate teacher's primary targets. But older Christians must also be reminded of the importance of Bible doctrine and, **in particular, the doctrines that relate to the return of Christ.**

Prophetic teaching must not lull us to sleep. Rather, it must awaken us to live godly lives and to seek to win the lost (Rom. 13:11–14).

Romans 13:11-14 Besides this you know the time, **that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep.** For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. **Let us walk properly as in the daytime,** not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. **But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.**

What the Bible teaches about the Day of the Lord was not invented by the Apostles. The prophets taught it and so did our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:2). Peter emphasized the unity of the Word of God.

When the scoffers denied “the power and coming” of Jesus Christ, they were denying the truth of the prophetic books, the teaching of our Lord in the Gospels, and the writing of the Apostles! Like our Lord’s seamless garment, the Scriptures cannot be cut apart without ruining the whole.

As far back as the days of Enoch, God warned that judgment was coming (Jude 14–15).

2 Peter 3:2-3 that you should remember the predictions of the holy prophets and the commandment of the Lord and Savior through your apostles, knowing this first of all, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own sinful desires.

Jude 1:14-15 It was also about these that Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied, saying, "**Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of his holy ones, to execute judgment on all and to convict all the ungodly of all their deeds of ungodliness that they have committed in such an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things that **ungodly sinners** have spoken against him."**

Read the Bible to be wise ...
